
EXPOSITION & INCENSATION

A sacristan goes to the Tabernacle, genuflects, removes the Blessed Sacrament.

The Presider signals to the choir loft, David asks people to kneel as the Priest processes to the Altar, and places the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance turned towards the faithful.

The Presider kneels before the altar and incenses the Blessed Sacrament as the Exposition Hymn is sung.

Priest: Let us pray. (brief pause)

Almighty and eternal God, in Christ your Son you have shown your glory to the world. Guide the work of your Church: help it proclaim your name, to persevere in faith and to bring salvation to people everywhere. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

The people respond: Amen.

All sit or kneel.



The Presider incenses the Blessed Sacrament as the Tantum Ergo is sung.

When the hymn ends the Presider says or chants: You have given them Bread from heaven.

All respond: Having within it all Sweetness.

Presider: Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of your suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood help us to experience the salvation you won for us and the peace of the kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.

The Presider dons the humeral veil and goes to the altar and the Blessed Sacrament. He genuflects, takes the monstrance, and makes the sign of the cross with it over the people in silence. He then replaces the monstrance on the altar, genuflects, and returns to the front of the Altar to kneel.

The presiding minister then leads the faithful in the recitation of the Divine Praises:

REPOSITION

As the Reposition Hymn is Sung, the presiding minister then genuflects, removes the Blessed Sacrament from the monstrance and places it in the tabernacle, and genuflects again.
